

North East Devolution

7 North East local authorities to become a North East Combined Authority (NECA)

Greater voice at a national level

Stronger investment proposition both nationally and internationally

Direct control over a 30 year, £1.4bn investment fund

Initial £20m regeneration fund with identified County Durham spend priorities (NETPark and Aykley Heads)

Improved collaboration across the region and our universities to transform how we drive innovation

Autonomy over our skills agenda

Manifesto themes:

Green transport that works for all

- Bring buses into public control; campaigning for Mayors to take control of key train stations
- 'Angel Network' linking bus, metro, train, ferry and active travel
- Expand Metro to Washington and invest in safety on public transport

New deal for North East workers

- Join up rivers, ports and coastline with a new Mayoral Development Corporation
- Green Energy and Engineering Super Academy to train 1,000 people a year
- Open North East Careers Hubs in villages and towns

Good quality, green homes

- Develop a Regional Spatial Plan and deliver thousands of houses on brownfield land
- Lobby to ensure the funds controlled by Homes England are handed to the Mayor
- Set standard for rented properties, build the greenest homes in the UK and retrofit social housing

Stronger neighbourhoods

- Measure every investment decision against its impact on child poverty
- Introduce Sure Start-style services; trial a Mayor's Childcare Grant for parents getting back to work or training
- Create a new High Streets Commission
- Fund after school clubs to deliver pre-apprenticeship training

World-class arts and culture

- Support region-wide music events, promote NE screen and writing sectors
- Lobby for a tourism levy to fund culture, events and infrastructure

Finance and Investment – Ensure that investment decisions are underpinned by a clear investment strategy that maximises leverage of the investment fund, set with a plan for generating positive jobs, skills and inclusive growth outcomes.



Environment, Coast and Rural – Placing the environment, the coast, and the growth of our rural areas at the heart of the economic strategy for the North East.



Economy – Build on the economic priorities, assets and potential across the 7 local authority areas; establishing a bold overall economic strategy that guides investment in the region, boosts growth and productivity and proactively guides our economic transition while reducing inequality.



Housing and Land – Set out bold ambitions for the North East; to improve the range, quality and affordability of housing; drive economic growth and productivity; and support the most vulnerable.



Education, Inclusion and Skills – Build an inclusive and sustainable economy that everyone can contribute to and benefit from, equipping residents with the skills and support needed for our economy to thrive.
