
Is There a Hidden Housing Need in Your Village? See What the Data Says About Your Parish

You might not think we've got a housing crisis here in rural County Durham – but the data tells a different story.

From Teesdale to Weardale and beyond, too many local people are being priced out of their own villages. Rents are high, houses are scarce, and young people are moving away because they simply can't afford to stay. At the same time, older residents wanting to downsize are finding it hard to stay local – because the right homes just aren't available.



But new housing is coming. And we need to shape it together.

The government has committed to boosting housing supply – and County Durham's target has increased by 53% under new planning guidelines. That means more homes are on the way. The question is: will they be the right ones for our rural communities?

That's where you come in.

Durham Community Action is here to help local people and parish councils understand what their area needs – and influence what gets built. As the Rural Housing Enabler, I am working with communities across the county to uncover hidden housing needs and support neighbourhoods to plan for the future.

You might be surprised by what the data shows in your area. Take Middleton-in-Teesdale, for example – 90% of residents there can't afford to rent a house at market prices. A high number of homes are under-occupied, second homes make up almost 15% of housing stock, and the need for affordable homes is growing every year.

Request a Parish Profile for Your Community

If you're not sure what the housing need looks like where you live, a parish profile is a great place to start. These handy summaries pull together key local housing data to paint a picture of affordability, availability and demographic change – and they can help spark really useful conversations in your community.
